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


GLOBAL HANDWASHING DAY












- Proper hand hygiene is the way to prevent the spread of germs.



THE SPECTRUM

A Spectrum is a band of seven colours violet indigo, blue, green, yellow, orange and red. A spectrum can be seen if the sun light is passed through a prism and allowed to gather on a white screen. This visible spectrum is a part of the large electromagnetic spectrum.

Spectroscopy is the study of spectra. A natural example of a spectrum is a rainbow. The word first used by scientist optics. The spectrum seen when light passes through a prism is an example of light. This implies that light travels a little slower in the material of the prism than surrounding it.

Airplanes are usually pushed through the air either by propellers or by jet engines. A propeller looks like two thin pointed wings joined end to end. As it spins around it forces air backward this pushes the airplane forward the engine of a propeller planes uses the power of burning fuel to turn the propeller. But a jet engine uses burning fuel to make the wheels of a turbine spin. The gases and air from the back of the engine push the plane forward. An Aeroplane with a jet engine can fly much faster than a propeller airplane. Large passenger airplanes are usually powered by jet engines. Some jumbo jets can carry more than 400 people. 

















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TORY TELLING


